Last Game: The Gary SouthShore RailCats won their first Regular-Season Division Title as members of the American Association and set a franchise-record for most wins in a single-season with their 59th after defeating the Kansas City T-Bones, 3-2, in comeback fashion on a rainy Labor Day afternoon at U.S. Steel Yard. Trailing 2-0 entering the bottom of the sixth, Gary scored three unanswered runs to win the final regular-season game of the year and secure the No. 1 seed in the North Division Series. Peyton Sanderlin (2-0) shined in his second professional start after getting activated from the seven-day disabled list before Monday's game. The right-hander went a career-high 7.1 innings, yielding two runs on seven hits, a walk and three strikeouts in the win while Myles Smith (8) recorded his team-high eighth hold after retiring both batters he faced, one via a strikeout, in the top of the eighth. Adam Quintana (12) secured the win with his second straight save in the top of the ninth after getting Tucker Pennell to groundout to him with runners on first and second to end the regular-season. Robert Calvano (0-1) was charged with the loss in his third appearance in as many days. In one inning of relief, the right-hander allowed one run on a hit and a walk.

Series at a Glance: Gary and St. Paul meet for the first time since in the postseason since the 2005 Northern League Semifinals when both clubs were members of the now defunct league. The RailCats went on to defeat the Saints, 3-2, in the best of five series before defeating the Fargo-Moorhead RedHawks, 3-2, in the best of five series for the franchise's first of three league championships. Both St. Paul and Gary finished with identical records in the 2018 regular-season (59-41), however, the RailCats were crowned as the regular-season division champions due to beating the Saints seven out of 13 times head-to-head.

St. Paul Starter: St. Paul sends Chris Nunn to mound in game one of the Northern Division Series after recording his second straight win on Wednesday vs. the Chicago Dogs. The southpaw went six innings, allowing one run on seven hits, walked none and struck four. Nunn recorded wins in four of his last starts in the month of August and posted a 3.11 ERA. A native of Nashville, Tenn., Nunn recorded the victory in his most recent start against Gary back on Aug. 10 at CHS Field after allowing one run on three hits, a walk and six strikeouts. The 27-year-old pitched in Double-A and in the Houston Astros minor league system earlier this season before signing with St. Paul. Nunn began his professional baseball career in 2012 after getting selected by the San Diego Padres in the 24th round of the 2012 MLB Draft out of Lipscomb University. Nunn spent four seasons in the Padres minor league system, reaching Double-A, before getting released. After not pitching in 2016, Nunn pitched for the Evansville Otters of the Frontier League in 2017 before having his contract purchased by the Chicago Cubs in August. Nunn was then selected in the Triple-A Phase of the 2017 MLB Rule 5 Draft in December by Houston.

Scouting St. Paul: St. Paul enters postseason play with one of the top offenses in all of the American Association after finishing second in the league in home runs (96), RBIs (511), doubles (194), hit by pitches (62) and slugging percentage (.434), and third in batting average (.289), runs (552), hits (1,012) and OPS (.796). Individually, the Saints have leaned heavily on three-time postseason all-star Brady Shoemaker, who was named the First Baseman of the Year after slashing .309/.406/.486/.891 with 19 doubles, 14 home runs, 69 RBIs, 168 total bases and 47 walks in 92 games. As a pitching staff, the Saints rank fifth in the AA with a 3.96 ERA. Defensively, St. Paul ranks eighth with a .972 fielding percentage and committed 105 errors, fifth most.

RailCats win North Division on final day of regular season: The Gary SouthShore RailCats won their first regular-season division championship since merging from the now defunct Northern League to the American Association in 2011 after Monday's 3-2, come-from-behind victory over the Kansas City T-Bones. Monday's win also set a franchise record for most wins in a single season (59). Despite finishing with the same record as St. Paul during the regular season, Gary claimed the division title due to beating the Saints seven out of 13 times in the head-to-head matchup. The 'Cats officially clinched the second and final playoff spot out of the North Division with Wednesday's 4-1 win over Sioux Falls and return to postseason for their second straight season for the first time as members of the AA.

RailCats Nuggets:

- Game one of the North Division Series between the Gary SouthShore RailCats and St. Paul Saints was postponed due to 100% chance of rain throughout the evening and the night on Tuesday and will now begin on Wednesday with game two following on Thursday
- The RailCats closed out the regular-season 15-5 in their last 20 games and finished with the best second half record in the North Division at 35-15 after Monday's 3-2 come-from-behind victory vs. the Kansas City T-Bones
- Gary activated RHP Gabe Perez from the Inactive List on Tuesday and released C Jeffrey Sneed
- The 'Cats activated RHP Peyton Sanderlin from the 7-Day Disabled List before Monday's final regular-season game vs. KC and placed LHP Mario Samuel on the 7-Day Disabled List retroactive to Sept. 1
- Gary drew a league record four intentional walks in Sunday's 3-2 extra-innings loss
- The RailCats acquired outfielder K.C. Huth from the Cleburne Railroaders in exchange for future considerations, re-signed catcher Jeffrey Sneed, signed and placed infielder Kevin Riley on the Inactive List, moved right-handed pitcher Gabe Perez from the Disabled List to the Inactive List, placed right-handed pitcher Robbie Counsel on the Inactive List and placed right-handed pitcher Peyton Sanderlin on the Disabled List before the Aug. 24th trade deadline expired
- The 'Cats outscored their opponents, 260-186, during the second half
- Gary scored 195 of their 460 runs (42%) during the regular season in the first three innings
- The RailCats hit seven home runs in their last six contests to close out the regular season
- Gary hit 35 of their 46 home runs over the last 59 games of the regular season after Tillman Pugh hit his seventh homer to lead off the top of the second on Sunday vs. KC
- The 'Cats made 17 errors in their last 16 games have committed an error in 15 of their last 20 contests of the regular season
- Tillman Pugh reached base safely in league-high 41 straight games to end the regular season after going 1-for-4 with a stolen base in the final regular-season game on Monday vs. KC
- Jorge De Leon allowed one run and struck out a career-best 10 batters over a career-high seven innings of relief on Sunday

Coaching Staff

Field Manager, Greg Tagert

Greg Tagert returns to the Gary SouthShore Railcats in 2018 for his 14th season (24th overall) as the team's manager. Tagert has won three league championships (2005, 2007, 2013) and has finished with a .500 or better record in every season except one since being named the team's manager in 2005.

The RailCats returned to the playoffs in 2017 for the first time since winning the American Association Championship in 2013. Down to the final game of the regular season, the 'Cats needed more than just a win to clinch a playoff berth. The RailCats had to defeat the Lincoln Saltdogs and needed Fargo-Moorhead to lose to Winnipeg. Both happened on Labor Day after Gary walked-off over Lincoln for the second straight game with a 3-2 win while the RedHawks fell to the reigning champion Winnipeg Goldeyes, 8-3.

Tagert, a four-time League Manager of the Year (2001, 2007, 2009, 2016) has led Gary to the playoffs eight times (six straight from 2005-2010), two Central Division Titles and has helped advance 24 former RailCats to affiliated baseball, including 2006 outfielder Nathan Haynes, who played in the MLB for the Los Angeles Angels and Tampa Bay Rays from 2007-2008. Tagert's most recent player to have his contract purchased by an MLB affiliate was shortstop Ryan Fitzgerald, who had his contract purchased by the Boston Red Sox on May 2, 2018.

Tagert has developed three Northern League Pitchers of the Year, two League Rookie of the Year winners, a Northern League Player of the Year, Defensive Player of the Year, five Baseball America All-Independent League selections, eight full-season Northern League All-Stars and two full-season American Association All-Stars.

Before becoming a professional manager in 1995, Tagert worked as a scout for the Detroit Tigers and as a pitching coach at the University of New Mexico. A native of Vacaville, Calif., Tagert pitched collegiately at San Francisco State University.

Tagert and his wife, Mary, have four children (sons Ben, Josh and Sam, and daughter, Elaine).

Pitching Coach, Alain Quijano

Alain Quijano returns to the Gary SouthShore RailCats in 2018 for his fourth straight season as the team's pitching coach. Since being named the team's pitching coach in 2015, Quijano has had five players have their contracts purchased by Major League Affiliates — RHP Matt Solter, 2016 (San Francisco Giants); LHP Alex Gunn, 2016 (Arizona Diamondbacks); RHP Christian Herstine, 2016 (New York Yankees); RHP Karl Triana (Baltimore Orioles); LHP Carlos Diaz, 2017 (Miami Marlins/Oakland Athletics).

Quijano played nine seasons of Independent Professional Baseball, including three with Gary (2009, 2011, 2013). Quijano's best season with the RailCats was on the 2013 Championship Team, where the southpaw won a career-high and RailCats single-season-high-tying 12 games. Quijano finished the season 12-7 with a 4.05 ERA in 21 starts, striking out 82 batters in 133.1 innings. Quijano concluded his professional baseball career in 2014 with the York Revolution of the Atlantic League, posting a 10-10 record with a 4.59 ERA in a career-high 28 starts and 168.2 innings pitched.

Quijano is also in his second season as the head baseball coach at Olive-Harvey College in Chicago, Ill.. Quijano resides in Oak Lawn, Ill., with his wife, Rebecca, and their two children (daughter Maryanna; son Maximus).

Hitting Coach, Bobby Spain

Bobby Spain returns to the Gary SouthShore RailCats in 2018 for his third straight season as the team's hitting coach. Since being named the team's hitting coach in 2016, Spain has had three position players have their contracts purchased by a Major League Affiliate — infielder Jose Sermo, 2016 (Boston Red Sox/Kansas City Royals); catcher Jose Gonzalez, 2016 (Minnesota Twins); infielder Ryan Fitzgerald, 2018 (Boston Red Sox).

Spain played four seasons of professional baseball (three affiliated, one independent). Spain's professional baseball career began in 2007 after being selected by the Pittsburgh Pirates in the 19th round of the 2007 MLB Draft out of Oklahoma City University. Spain spent three seasons in the Pirates organization, reaching as high as Lo-A. A native of Colorado Springs, Colo. Spain was selected by the San Diego Padres in the 39th round of the 2004 MLB Draft out of Norman High School but didn't sign.

Spain is also in his fourth season as an assistant coach at his alma mater, Oklahoma City University. Spain resides in Norman, Okla.

Third Base Coach, Mike Habas

Mike Habas returns to the Gary SouthShore RailCats for his second season in 2018 as the team's first base coach. Habas played collegiately at Moraine Valley Community College and South Suburban College before transferring to Division II North Greenville University after his sophomore season. As a junior in 2014, Habas hit .227 with seven RBIs and four doubles in 22 games for the Crusaders.

Habas graduated from Homewood-Flossmoor High School in 2009 and was named to the All-Area team as a senior. Habas resides in Homewood, Ill.
